A Business Dialogue on Bendigo's Future

The key to the ongoing growth and prosperity of Bendigo lies in our capacity to attract and retain a highly skilled workforce that will drive the future development of our businesses and organisations.

Our dynamic panel will discuss why they've opted to stay, come back, or chosen Bendigo as their career and business destination as they explore future opportunities for Bendigo and provide valuable suggestions on emerging industries to enhance our prospects for a brighter future.

Marking the 150th Anniversary of Higher Education in Bendigo, Be.Bendigo is joining forces with La Trobe University's Business School to present an important dialogue examining "What's next?" for Bendigo.

Last year's 'Regionalisation Ambition 2032' from the Regional Australia Institute (RAI) makes a strong argument for the factors that will contribute to a greater proportion of Australians living prosperously in the regions by 2032 and beyond.

Among the key pillars of the ambitious targets set in the RAI Report are those relating to Jobs & Skills, and Productivity & Innovation. Recognising that a key factor in responding to changing skills requirements in an evolving jobs market is for members of our community to have access to the training and higher level qualifications required, Bendigo has a significant advantage with the strong local presence of La Trobe University and Bendigo TAFE providing opportunities for those already in the Bendigo region, but also continuing to attract ambitious people to the City.

This dialogue, which the organisers hope will spark further discussions and community debate, is part of the process of thinking about what sort of city we want Bendigo to become, and what we need to start considering or doing now in order to get there over the next fifteen or twenty years.

They suggest that listening to the optimism and insights of people who see the city with fresh eyes can often act as a catalyst for us all to think about the future differently – to appreciate some things that we've taken for granted, and to imagine other possibilities.

Be.Bendigo and La Trobe are encouraging local people to come along to the discussion and engage with our panellists as they share their excitement for the future.
